In Memory of H. Frank Queen

It is with deep sorrow that Rutherford EMC reports the recent death of director emeritus H. Frank Queen of Morganton. Mr. Queen passed away peacefully on September 14, 2021, at the home place where he was born and raised.

Mr. Queen took great pride in serving on the Rutherford EMC board. He served whole-heartedly

during his tenure, and was always in attendance at meetings and ready to travel to conventions to speak and learn on behalf of the co-op. He was even granted the opportunity once to meet with Senator Jesse Helms in Washington, D.C., to promote the cooperative's efforts. Queen retired from the board in May of 2021 due to a rapid decline in health. He was honored at his final meeting with a special tribute celebration where he was presented with a plaque for his 58 years of tireless service and dedication to Rutherford EMC.

Queen was a lifelong member of the Bethel United Methodist Church located on Dysartville Road in Morganton, and it was at Bethel that he met the love of his life, Sarah Margaret Poteat. He often stated that walking Sarah home from church on their first date was the smartest thing he ever did. He enlisted in the US Army on his 18th birthday and served in Korea. In 1952, Queen, along with his uncle, started Marion Equipment Company; here he went from working as a salesman to owning the business and hosting hundreds of people at his annual customer appreciation day event, whose numerous attendees included Henry Ford II. He ran the Marion Equipment Company very successfully until his retirement in 1998, when he turned the business over to his son.

Queen was a natural born farmer. From the

first acre of land that he purchased with borrowed money, he grew his farm to become one of the largest land owners in McDowell County. His vast farming operation will likely continue on long after his death. Cattle will continue to be raised and sold, corn will continue to be grown and harvested, and hay will still be cut and put up for years to come. Even in Queen's last days he was ready to ride by his corn fields and admire the long rows and tall stands across the mile-long bottom. He was a member and past president of the NC Cattlemen's Association and the Burke County Cattlemen's Association.

Mr. Queen is survived by his son Bruce W. Queen (Brenda); daughter Anne Giles Falls (Larry); grandchildren, Kevin W. Queen (Maria) and Kelly Giles McFarland (Haze); great-grandchildren, Conner Queen, Abby Queen, Morgan C. Bunton (Jesse), Anna Crawley (Trevor), Giles Crawley, Ali McFarland; 4 great-grandchildren, and numerous nieces and nephews.

Queen was a remarkable business man. The leadership he demonstrated always carried a vast amount of knowledge and experience when discussing the co-ops business and the communities it served. Rutherford EMC's directors, employees, and members express their heartfelt sympathy to the Queen family.

Additional WPCA Credit Reflects Coal Ash Settlement

On October 1, your electric bill began showing an even larger credit for the Wholesale Power Cost Adjustment (WPCA). The WPCA reflects increases or decreases in the cost of electricity that Rutherford EMC purchases from its wholesale power suppliers for distribution. The co-op's board of directors approved a credit of \$4.00 per 1,000 kilowatt-hours (kWh) of electricity used by members beginning August 1, then at the

September board meeting it was approved to increase the WPCA credit to \$8.00 per 1,000 kilowatt-hours. This credit continues as a result of the cooperative's portion of funds received from Duke Energy's coal ash settlement approved by the North Carolina Utilities Commission (NCUC) for Duke's retail customers.

The settlement with the NC Attorney General, NCUC, and the Sierra Club resolves how

Duke will pay to clean up its coal ash. Last year, Duke Energy announced the largest coal ash cleanup in national history with the utility to excavate the majority of its remaining coal ash at 14 coal plants. That effort encompasses the removal of 124 million tons of coal ash.

The retail settlement reduces Duke's ability to recover from its customers the full cost associated with coal ash cleanup and is considered a "win" for Duke Energy customers. Rutherford EMC is a wholesale customer, purchasing wholesale power from Duke Energy Carolinas and we have a provision in our wholesale power contract that provides Rutherford EMC the same benefits as a retail customer regarding coal ash costs and this settlement agreement.

While Rutherford EMC doesn't own any coal plants, environmental regulations related to the management of coal ash and its clean up impact the price all North Carolina utilities pay for wholesale power. We are very pleased to be able to return the funds received from the wholesale power provider, as a result of this settlement, back to our members.

Rutherford EMC strives daily to operate efficiently while adhering to our mission of providing you with reliable electric service at the lowest possible cost. We are very excited to have this opportunity to offer an additional credit on the WPCA line item of your monthly bill due to this settlement.

NC Electric Cooperatives Youth Tour

Seeking High School Juniors : Apply NOW for the Summer Leadership Experience of a Lifetime on the Youth Tour to Washington, D.C.

Rutherford EMC is seeking applications from current high school juniors for the leadership opportunity of a lifetime: The Electric Cooperative Youth Tour to Washington, D.C. Join the state's future leaders for a week of exploration, education and leadership training during the summer of 2022.

The Youth Tour allows students to experience Washington, D.C., and learn more about how they can make a difference as young adults. Youth Tourists will learn about the cooperative business model and values by running their own "H2O Co-Op", visit historic monuments and memorials, meet with elected officials and tour a variety of museums, all while building confidence and a peer network with young leaders from across the country.

Rutherford EMC will sponsor three local students to join North Carolina's delegation. A winner and an alternate will be chosen from each of our operating districts in January to represent the cooperative on the 2022 NC Youth Tour.

The all-expense-paid, weeklong tour is hosted by electric cooperatives nationwide and is a tradition more than 50 years strong. Be a part of the 40-plus outstanding high school students selected from electric cooperatives across the state to travel to our nation's capital. We are optimistic this will be the first Youth Tour trip to D.C. since 2019, as COVID precautions have prevented travel the last two years.

Co-op officials and past Youth Tour participants agree: this is the perfect way for students to see democracy up close and in action. "The Youth Tour is an opportunity for students to have an eye-opening backstage pass to our nation's capital," said Dirk Bursleson, General Manager of Rutherford EMC. Our student delegates will meet with members of North Carolina's congressional delegation, connect with a network of extremely talented peers, and grow their leadership skills as well as ambitions. Take a step out of your comfort zone and apply for this tremendous opportunity.

If you're a current high school junior who wants to grow as a leader, NC Youth Tour is the perfect opportunity to build your skills, gain new experiences and form valuable relationships with others.
