Attorney Beth Miller assumed chairmanship of the meeting and explained REMC’s Bylaw provisions for the election of directors by district and term. Attorney Miller explained that the election of directors for 2025 has been conducted by written or electronic ballot. Attorney Miller presented the report from the Nominating Committee indicating the nominees for the election of directors by district were as follows:

Attorney Miller stated that over 800 members participated in the election process by submitting their written ballots. She stated that The Credential and Election Committee members verified the ballots and tabulated the results.

Based upon the verified ballots received, Jill P. Lovell for District 1; Joseph N. Quinn for District 2 and Robyn D. Houser for District 3 were duly elected to serve until the expiration of their terms for which they were elected or until their successors shall have been elected and qualified. Attorney Miller requested that the Secretary annex to the minutes the certificate declaring by name the directors elected.

Attorney Miller then asked for any additional business and there was none.

Attorney Miller obtained a motion and second that the meeting adjourns. Motion was unanimously passed.

Following the meeting, a total of thirty-seven prizes were awarded to members by the drawing from registration cards.
